The Hershey Food Bank is a 501 (c) (3) all-volunteer organization that has served the Hershey/Derry Township community for 57 years. In 2023, our dedicated volunteers gave over 10,000 hours of service to the food bank.

WHO WE SERVE:

Clients of the food bank must be residents of Derry Township, or attend a church in the township. Prospective clients go through an application process, and must be recertified annually. The food bank does not and shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation in any of its activities or operations. The bulk of our clients are the working poor, underemployed, senior citizens, single parents, and/or those with disabilities. Some families use the food bank twice a month, some once, and some less often. The number of clients changes slightly from month to month as families no longer require our support, move out of the area, or new clients apply.

- In 2023, the food bank provided assistance to an average of 837 individuals each month; December saw the highest number of clients at 1,118. The total number of individuals for the year was 10,043 which includes 3,909 children.

THE FOOD WE PROVIDE:

We are a choice food bank. Families use a shopping cart to shop and select items they use or need. As much as possible, we accommodate special diet needs and requests. At each distribution (twice monthly) clients receive:

- ·Meats
- ·Frozen vegetables
- ·Dairy products such as milk, eggs, cheese and yogurt
- ·Fresh seasonal produce, such as potatoes, carrots, onions, cabbage, celery, tomatoes, cucumbers, apples, grapes, and peaches
- ·Non-perishable items, such as fruits, vegetables, pasta, canned meat, cereals, juices
- ·Bread and dessert items
- ·Paper products, household cleaning supplies, and personal hygiene products
 - In 2023, a total of 96,545 pounds of food was donated to the food bank from various organizations, businesses, and individuals.
 - 195,936 pounds of food was purchased by the food bank for distribution to clients.
 - 292,734.5 pounds of food in total was distributed to our cllients in 2023



ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE:

We may, on an as-needed basis, also provide emergency financial assistance primarily for utility bills and rent payments if funds are available. Many cases may also be referred to Social Service agencies or Financial Budgeting counseling for further assistance.

- In 2023 we provided \$28,333 in emergency assistance.
- At Christmas 241 children received gift cards for clothing. In addition to those provided by the food bank, many were generously donated by local churches, and individuals.



OUR FUNDING:

We are blessed by a very generous and caring community that supports our organization's mission and those we serve. In 2023, our funding was comprised of:

- 34%...Individual
- 28% ... Estate (Endowment)
- 19%...Businesses/Corporations
- 12%...Churches
- 6%...Clubs/Organizations
- 1%...Workplace Giving

*Fundraiser donations accounted for **31**% of our proceeds (included in Individual and Business funding above).



FUNDRAISERS:

Two fundraisers were held in **2023** to benefit the food bank. Feed the Need is the food bank's largest fundraiser, which is made possible by donations and partnerships from many generous community restaurants, businesses, and individuals. We also held a Giving Tuesday drive in November.
